2009-10 FINAL REGISTRATION-WEDNESDAY, JULY 29 & AUGUST 5-Registration for the 2009-10 school year will be held on Wednesday, July 29, and August 5, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and in the evening from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. in the school cafeteria. All high school students must come to finalize their schedules. Parents of students in grades K-8 who have pre-registered will need to come only to pay their fees and first month's tuition.

According to School Advisory Council policy for a student to be officially enrolled at Sacred Heart Catholic School and participate in extra-curricular activities, as well as for liability insurance reasons, the first month's tuition and all school fees must be paid at the registration on Wednesday, July 29, or August 5, 2009. Students will not be allowed to begin football or volleyball practice until these fees have been paid. You may make partial payments in advance at the rectory or school if you so desire.

Please call the school at 798-4251 if you have any questions or concerns regarding registration for the 2009-10 school year. Limited tuition assistance is available. Please see the principal for an application.

Classes will begin at Sacred Heart Catholic School on Monday, August 17.

SPIRIT SHIRT & DRESS FOR JESUS SHIRT ORDER DAY - Please remember that all students in grades K-12 are required to wear an approved Sacred Heart Catholic School Spirit Shirt daily. The main purpose of this policy is to promote modesty and positive Catholic moral standards in regards to dress.

FRESHMEN ORIENTATION, TUESDAY, AUGUST 11 AT 7:00 P.M. - Freshmen Orientation will be held on Tuesday, August 11, in the Sacred Heart Cafeteria at 7:00 p.m. The agenda for the meeting will include high school graduation requirements, honors program, dual credit courses, National Honor Society, counseling services and resources, and the high school standardized testing program. All Sacred Heart Catholic High School freshmen and their parents are invited and strongly encouraged to attend this very important meeting. Refreshments will be served.

5TH GRADE ORIENTATION – THURSDAY, AUGUST 13 AT 7:00 P.M. – There will be a 5th grade orientation held on Thursday, August 13, in the Sacred Heart Cafeteria at 7:00 p.m. All 5th grade students and their parents are strongly encouraged to attend.

The agenda will include presentation of information regarding procedures and expectations of students entering junior high. Fifth grade teachers will be introduced and will give a brief presentation regarding their subject areas.

CHANGES IN TEXAS IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS-On March 5, 2009, the Executive Commissioner on Health & Human Services approved several revisions to the “Immunization Requirements for Children and Students in Texas Public and Private Schools” [Title 25. Health Services, Chapter 97, Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §97.61 and §§97.63-97.77].

The changes to the requirements were made in order to update the Texas elementary and secondary school immunization requirements so that they adhere more closely to the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP). These changes include:

- **Hepatitis A Vaccine:** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering **KINDERGARTEN, STATEWIDE, WILL BE REQUIRED TO HAVE 2 DOSES OF Hepatitis A vaccine.**
- **Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) Vaccine:** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering **KINDERGARTEN** will be required to have two doses of measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine.
- **Varicella Vaccine:** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering **KINDERGARTEN AND 7TH GRADE** will be required to have 2 doses of varicella vaccine. A written statement from a parent (or legal guardian or managing conservator), school nurse, or physician attesting to a child’s positive history of varicella disease (chickenpox), or of varicella immunity, is acceptable in lieu of either dose of varicella vaccine.
- **Tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis-containing vaccine (Tdap):** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering the **SEVENTH GRADE** will be required to have one dose of Tdap vaccine. Students in the seventh grade will be required to have a booster dose of Tdap only if it has been five years since their last dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine. Students in grades 8-12 are required to have a booster dose of Tdap if it has been ten years since their previous dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine. Td is acceptable in lieu of Tdap if a contraindication to pertussis exists.
- **Menigococcal Vaccine:** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering **7th GRADE** will be required to have one dose of meningococcal vaccine.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT CLASS-The Diocese of Victoria has created the Safe Environment program to assist parishes and schools in creating a healthy and safe environment for our children and youth. Once the initial class is completed, renewals are required every three (3) years.

The process for all **NEW** applicants is (1) to complete an on-line application/background check and (2) to attend an orientation session regarding the “Code of Pastoral Conduct/Policy Regarding Sexual Abuse of Minors” and “Keeping Kids SAFE.” The workshop must be attended within 90 days of the online application/background check completion.

Sacred Heart Catholic School is offering this Safe Environment and Renewal Training on August 10 from 6:00-7:30 p.m. for new employees/volunteers. The session will be held in the Family Center.

**DUAL CREDIT (HIGH SCHOOL/COLLEGE) COURSES OFFERED

2009-10 SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL- The 2009-10 Sacred Heart Catholic School Advisory Council members are as follows: Shirley Hollas, Wendy Leopold, Jim Mullen, Susan Opela, Glenn Steffek and Steven Steffek.

The pastor of Sacred Heart Parish is an ex-officio non-voting member. The principal acts as the executive officer of the school advisory council and is also an ex-officio non-voting member.

The school advisory council is established by the pastor, in accord with the Victoria Diocesan policy, to assist him and the principal in the governance of Sacred Heart Catholic School.

The school advisory council is consultative in the following sense: The members cannot act apart from the pastor and principal and cannot make decisions binding on the parish school without the approval of the pastor.

The school advisory council meets monthly in the teachers' workroom, and generally it is the 2nd Monday of each month. The meetings are open to the general public.

TUITION AND FEES POLICY

The Sacred Heart Catholic School Advisory Council prior to registration sets the registration fee and tuition for students. A sliding scale for families with more than one child is designed to make a Catholic education possible. When hardship cases are brought to the attention of the principal and/or pastor, financial arrangements can be made.

Since the school must operate on a budgeted month to month basis, tuition must be paid monthly. The Advisory Council has established the following policy for tuition payments:

1. The first month's tuition and school fees are due at the time of registration in August.
2. Tuition is due by the 10th of each month thereafter.
3. Tuition charges not paid by the 30th of each month are considered delinquent.
4. **It is the responsibility of any parent having problems making payments to contact the principal and/or pastor and complete an Application For Tuition Assistance Form.**
5. Previous years' tuition and school fees will have to be paid before registration will be allowed, unless judged to be a hardship case by the principal and/or pastor, and/or review committee.
6. Failure to comply with the above requirements may result in the following actions by the school:
 - A. Semester/Final exams will not be administered.
 - B. Semester/Final report cards will be withheld.
 - C. **STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN EXTRACURRICULA ACTIVITIES (ATHLETICS, CHEERLEADING, TWIRLERS, ETC.)**
 - D. Student will not be allowed to register for the following school year.
7. All school records (report cards, transcripts, etc.) including graduation, will be withheld until full payment of all fees is made.
